Session One (Morning)

Overview of Paul and His Letters

As one of the great leaders in the Bible, Paul was second only to Christ Jesus in the early story of Christianity. Paul spent thirty courageous and tireless years spreading the Gospel message to Gentiles. Walking, sailing, or riding thousands of miles, Paul of Tarsus courageously preached and healed where no one had gone before. This talk provides historical, political, geographical, cultural and religious background to better understand Paul's seven authenticated letters, as well as explore how the ministry of Paul developed and grew against all odds. We will also explore Paul's first letter, I Thessalonians, understanding the tears and triumphs of that newly formed Christian community.

Session Two (Afternoon)

Galatians

In these brief six chapters, Paul provides the most spirited defense of his teachings as well as his most complete autobiography. We'll investigate the Galatian people's background, temperament and character, and especially consider the key teachings of sin, grace, law and freedom. We will see how Paul used his knowledge of the Hebrew Scriptures to bring forward ancient lessons to apply to his contemporaries. And Paul can teach us much about contemporary communication in this short epistle.

I Corinthians

A quite different letter to a new audience on a separate continent, I Corinthians delivers a new set of challenges for the apostle as he works with sophisticated Romans from Greek heritage. In this seaport city known for its sensuality, Paul confronts multiple hurdles when sharing the teachings of Christ Jesus with a wealthy and self-satisfied citizenry. This first letter to the Corinthians may contain several letter exchanges, each chapter revealing the master apostle at his patient, and times, exacerbated but shepherding best. By looking at the history, geography, cultural and religious practices of this fascinating ancient city, we find contemporary parallels to how to work with each other in our collective communities.
